
Dr. Francis Kariuki, Deputy Director, SDRC

He is also a listed arbitrator and mediator with the Nairobi Centre for International Arbitrator (NCIA) in Kenya, and a member of SDRC. Hon. Justice Isaac Lenaola, FCIArb, CBS Justice of the Supreme Court of Kenya



Hon. Justice Isaac Lenaola was appointed on 27th October, 2016 and assumed office on 28th October, 2016 as a Judge of the Supreme Court. He heads the Supreme Court Judicial Function Operations, Bar-Bench Relations, Relations with Non-Domestic Courts and International Courts as well as Information Communication Technology Portfolio.

Prior to his appointment, he was a Judge of the High Court of Kenya, and Judge and Deputy Principal Judge of the Court of First Instance of the East African Court of Justice (2011-2018). He is the Vice-President (2024) and Judge at the Residual Special Court for Sierra Leone (2013 to-date). He practiced law, served as a Commissioner in the Constitution of Kenya Review Commission (CKRC), and was a Member of the Tribunal Investigating the Conduct of Puisne Judges.

Hon. Justice Isaac Lenaola served as a Commissioner at the Judicial Service Commission and is the President of the Advisory Council of the Strathmore Institute for Advanced Studies in International Criminal Justice; President, International Association of Refugee and Migration Judges (IARMJ); and Chairman Emeritus, Judicial Action Group. He is a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators, and McLaughlin College, York University, Toronto, Canada.

He was awarded the LSK Distinguished Service Award (2008); East African Law Society Honorary Membership Award (2015); Jurist of the Year ICJ-Kenya Chapter (2019); IARMJ Distinguished Service Awards (2014 and 2018); and National Honours of the Moran of the Order of the Burning Spear (MBS), and Chief of the Order of the Burning Spear (CBS).

He is an Advocate of the High Court of Kenya, holds a Bachelor of Laws (LLB) from the University of Nairobi, and Post-Graduate Diploma from the Kenya School of Law.

Allan M. Mukuki, LLD Candidate, LLM (Groningen, The Netherlands), PGDip (KSL), LLB (Hons) (UoN), MCIArb (London), Advocate of the High Court of Kenya, Commissioner for Oaths and Notary Public, SDRC Accredited Mediator



Allan Mukuki is a distinguished legal professional with over 10 years of experience across legal practice, academia, research, and consultancy. Currently pursuing a Doctor of Laws (LLD) at Stellenbosch University, he is recognised as a thought leader in public international law, refugee law, and human rights law. He holds a Master of Laws from the University of Groningen and a Bachelor of Laws from the University of Nairobi. Additionally, he is a scholar of the Hague Academy of International Law and has served as a Visiting Fellow at the Refugee Studies Centre at Oxford University. Mukuki is an Advocate of the High Court of Kenya, a Commissioner for Oaths, and a Notary Public.

Throughout his career, Allan has demonstrated exceptional leadership in legal research, consultancy, and academia. He has been vital in developing groundbreaking legal initiatives and policies, including the High Court Registry Manual for Kenya, IGAD's Regional Refugee Management Framework, the Nairobi Strategy for Refugee Integration and Community Building and both strategic plans for Kenya's Office of the Data Protection Commissioner. His advisory roles with global organisations have addressed significant issues, including data protection and international criminal justice.

As a faculty member at Strathmore Law School, Mukuki has played a pivotal role in curriculum development and training the next generation of legal professionals. He has negotiated over 45 Memoranda of Understanding (MOUS) with universities across five continents and managed high-value projects, including the Academic Trip Project. A champion for access to justice, he is involved with the Strathmore Law Clinic, providing pro bono legal aid to underserved communities.

Mukuki's academic contributions include peer-reviewed articles, book chapters, and reports on climate change and migration policy. He is a sought-after speaker and trainer at prestigious global conferences.

In 2024, Business Daily honoured him with the "Top 40 Under 40" Award, and in 2022 and 2025, he was named Best Lecturer at Strathmore Law School. He is committed to social impact, serving as the founding director of The Spear Foundation, which supports educational initiatives for underprivileged children. His role as Board Chairperson for HIAS Kenya underscores his dedication to equitable policies for refugees.

Prof. Kariuki Muigua, Ph.D., FCIArb. (Chartered Arbitrator), OGW



He is an Advocate of the High Court of Kenya; Professor of law, University of Nairobi, Faculty of Law; Member of the Permanent Court of Arbitration (PCA) He served as the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators (CIArb) Regional Trustee for Africa from 2019 to 2022.

He has on various occasions been appointed by leading arbitral institutions including the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators (CIArb-Kenya), the Nairobi Centre for International Arbitration (NCIA), the International Chamber of Commerce (ICC) and the London Court of International Arbitration (LCIA) among other institutions, as both as a sole arbitrator and a member of arbitral tribunals in arbitrations involving commercial disputes.

He became the first winner of the Inaugural CIArb (Kenya Branch) ADR Lifetime Achievement Award 2021. He was also the winner of the ADR Practitioner of the Year Award 2021 given by the Nairobi LSK and the ADR Publisher of the Year 2021 awarded by CIArb Kenya. He is rated by Chambers and Partners as one of the best dispute resolvers in the country. He has published in the areas of ADR and Access to Justice, Environment, and Natural Resources.
